## **INDUSTRIAL WIND TURBINES – “UNWILLING HOST”**

The Council of the Township of North Frontenac unanimously passed Resolution #328-15 on June 10<sup>th</sup> declaring the **Township of North Frontenac as “Not a Willing Host” for Industrial Wind Turbine Projects.**

Council received community input both in favour and not in favour of the proposed Industrial Wind Turbine Projects, which showed a clear majority oppose having these in our municipality.

“If this project still proceeds without our support, as it could based on the Green Energy Act and a successful bid by a Proponent, Council will continue to be diligent and do what is within its power to oppose these projects,” says Mayor Ron Higgins. “A ‘one size fits all’ solution to development in Ontario does not work.”

Council promotes a healthy and sustainable Community by supporting the financial well-being of the municipality. The community, Council, and staff continue to ensure our municipality is viable for the future.

North Frontenac Township is situated in the heart of Eastern Ontario’s cottage country. With over two hundred beautiful lakes, forests, rich minerals and abundance of fish and wildlife and some of the most exceptional dark skies in southern Canada (*North Frontenac Township is the first municipality in Canada to receive a Dark Sky Preserve designation from the Royal Astronomical Society of Canada*); making our municipality one of the best destinations in Ontario. Also, our Township is the only municipality in Ontario that runs a Crown Land Stewardship Program through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Ministry of Natural Resources.
